THE COURT: I think we need to make Number 12 an alternate because he slept through my instructions. But he's still been sleeping off and on.

MS. RUNDLES: Uh-huh.

MR. KETTLEWELL: Which one is that?

THE COURT: Number 12.

MR. KETTLEWELL: Which one?

THE COURT: Large one in the back with the glasses.

MR. KETTLEWELL: Well, all right. I didn't notice

that, but I wasn't watching.

RUNDLES: He might have been awake during yours. THE COURT: Yeah. MS. RUNDLES: And I noticed him sleeping during mine. THE COURT: Yeah. I -- so I think I need to make him an alternate. 10 MR. KETTLEWELL: Well, I think we're going to object to 11 that, Your Honor. I don't see a need for that at this time. 12 THE COURT: Sleeping through testimony? 13 MR. KETTLEWELL: Well, it wasn't testimony. 14 THE COURT: Well --15 MR. KETTLEWELL: And you're going to have the written 16 charge in the jury room, I take it. 17 THE COURT: Right. 18 MR. KETTLEWELL: And there are 11 other jurors who --19 THE COURT: He -- right. He slept through a lot of 20 testimony. I mean, he wasn't as bad as the juror we excused, but 21 he slept through testimony. MR. ANDERSON: Isn't he the one that said that he

closed his eyes to concentrate? THE COURT: No. That was --3 MR. KETTLEWELL: That was the little guy in the No. front row. 5 THE COURT: -- that's the one with the tie at the end. 6 MR. ANDERSON: I'm sorry. 7 THE COURT: Yeah. 8 MR. KETTLEWELL: It was a different guy. THE COURT: Yeah. MS. RUNDLES: Well, I do think that Number 12 has been 10 sleeping on and off throughout the entire trial. And as I 11 mentioned, I wasn't watching him during the defense closing, but 12 during my closing I noticed that he appeared to be sleeping. And 13 I know that the Court just noticed he was sleeping during 14 instructions, so I think that it's probably a good idea to make 15 him an alternate. I also think we need to talk about --17 THE COURT: Number 9. 18 19 MS. RUNDLES: Yes. THE COURT: She has a plane ticket for Monday. 20 MR. KETTLEWELL: Yeah. But this is Wednesday, Judge. 21 MR. ANDERSON: My understanding of the statute, Your 22 Honor, and I specifically to RSA 500-A:8 and 14, is that once
